



Autumn Term 1

English

This term in English we will be writing a variety of non-fiction genres in addition to a range of descriptive passages. Their fiction writing will culminate in a narrative based on 'Wonder'. Learning will include a clear focus on the skills of drafting and editing in preparation for more detailed writing later in the year. Year 6 will continue to develop their knowledge of different forms of punctuation and grammatical terms and be expected to use a wide variety taught throughout Key Stage 2.

Maths

In Maths, Year 6 will continue to learn maths following the Maths No Problem scheme. This scheme is based on the highly effective, research based Singapore method of teaching mathematics. The children will be covering key concepts such as place value along with more problem based questions that will require them to use all four operations.

Science

In Science, the Year 6 topic is classification, big and small. The children will broaden their knowledge of how vertebrates, invertebrates, plants and micro-organisms are grouped using shared characteristics. They discover how Carl Linnaeus developed the Linnaean and binomial systems for classifying and naming living things.

We will also be learning:

History

We will be learning about rebuilding Britain after WW2. The children will learn about the causes of WW2 and how life in Britain was impacted by the war. There will be focus on evacuation and the changing role of women.

Geography

We studying what causes changes in population. The children will look at why population changes and conducting research into birth and death rates. They will understand why people migrate and how climate change is impacting the population.

Music

They will learn the dimensions of music along with singing and playing instruments.

PSHE

We will be exploring the topic 'Being in my world.'

French

Year 6 will be studying the unit 'Visiting a French town'.

Art

Make my voice heard. Exploring art with a message, children look at the famous 'Guernica' by Picasso and the confronting works of Käthe Kollwitz. They develop their drawings to incorporate new surfaces, a range of techniques and demonstrate an emerging personal style.
